	This session will include a multi-sector panel discussion followed by Q&A. Topics for discussion include the role of a governance body in developing a vision, lessons learned from industry implementation, high-level governance needs, and the appropriate scope of governance.
10:45 – 12:00	<b>Session 2 – The importance of balance and sector neutrality</b>
	This session will start with a brief presentation of the PDSA proposals designed to promote balance and sector neutrality, followed by a multi-sector panel discussion of the structural and procedural elements governance that will impact balance and sector neutrality, such as: board seat allocation, membership for corporate families, structural safeguards, and escalation of sector-specific disagreements. Q&A will follow the panel discussion.

	<p>This session will include a brief presentation of the PDSA proposals around membership and pathways for broad stakeholder input in governance followed by two separate panel discussions with Q&amp;A.</p> <p>Panel 1 will be a multi-sector discussion among trading partners related to importance of trading partner-driven governance and broad stakeholder participation</p>

	in governance, the optimal roles for trading partners and trade associations, and the boundaries of governance (e.g., what it means to govern interoperability).
1:15 – 2:00	<b>Session 3B – The needs and roles of the broad stakeholder community in governance</b>
	Panel 2 will be a multi-stakeholder panel of solution providers, standards organizations, and thought leaders around current approaches to governance, the boundaries of standards development, and the governance needs that should be addressed by a future governance body.
2:00 – 2:55	<b>Session 4 – A path forward</b>
	In this session, a multi-sector panel will have a culminating discussion around tactical path forward on governance. Topics of discussion will include a timeline for governance body formation, major steps/decisions for formation (e.g., funding), and a process for regulator engagement.
